Ethno-drama as a Field Research Approach in Vulnerable Contexts and Marginalized Communities

Na tribini će govoriti dr. sc. Nena Močnik
(Sveučilište u Ljubljani i New Europe College Bucharest)

The audience will be introduced to the philosophy and practice of theatre-based methodological approach, applied to social science research in vulnerable contexts (post-war, natural disasters, etc.) and marginalized communities (survivors of political violence, refugees, victims of on-going political oppressions, etc.). We will first examine the ethical concerns of work in such context and question the (unbalanced) role of the researcher and research participants.

In the second part, the lecturer will present her long-term field research work and concrete application of drama techniques with the survivors of war-rapes during the war in Balkans in 90s. At the end of the course we will draw some directions into how to collect, analyze and disseminate data, gathered through primarily non-verbal research principles.

NENA MOČNIK (University of Ljubljana and New Europe College Bucharest) is an engaged researcher, educator and performance artist. Her interdisciplinary work focuses on political violence, cultures of conflict, social oppression and sexualities.
